We are interested in the latest developments in philosophical theories pertaining to what are traditionally considered 'big philosophical questions' and we aim to establish a point of contact for philosophers working in separate areas in order to jointly explore the power of philosophy to address human experience and the complexities of our everyday lives, social and political institutions, ethical interactions, creative and knowledge-seeking practices, culture and language.

We also invite postgraduate and doctorate students to present their works in the student session, with allocated time of 20 minutes. All the papers presented at the conference are eligible for publication in the **Croatian Journal of Philosophy**.

In addition to the sessions on general topics, we will host a session dedicated to the research project entitled *Rationality: between Logically Ideal and Commonsensical in Everyday Reasoning*, and a series of lectures dedicated to poetry, narrative and fiction.
